FISHING AND HUNTING

The Linville and Watauga rivers, with their almost innumerable tributaries, form a perfect network of clear mountain streams that have been the native home of the speckled trout from time immemorial. These streams are convenient to the various resorts along the lines, are systematically restocked from a near-by fishery and afford rare sport for the angler, amid scenic surroundings and climatic conditions that are ideal. Good hunting including quail, ruffed grouse, pheasant and even black bear may be had.

RESORTS AND SUMMER COLONIES

Almost every station along the lines, from Elizabethton, Tenn., to Linville and Pineola, N. C., and beyond, is the favorite summering place of some coterie of mountain visitors. Each point possesses its own peculiar charms of altitude, climate or scenery and appeals with special attractiveness to its own particular clientele. Scores of hotels, inns and boarding-houses, on and adjacent to the lines, have sought out locations of special interest and scenic beauty and offer their guests accommodations at rates varying according to the character of service.
